ZACH FRICK was named to the All Academic Team and DREW DOMINICK was named to the All County Team by the Newberry Touchdown Club.



2020 Budget Adopted, Officers Set

At the annual congregation meeting on Dec. 8,



BUDGET

Johnny Merck was elected congregation vice president, and Lynn Wessinger was elected congregation secretary. Both have voice and vote on Council. We give thanks to Everett Crafts for his service as congregation vice president for the past two years.

At the annual meeting, the congregation also adopted a 2020 min-

istry budget of \$147,152. This reflects various budget adjustments, including a decrease in Mission Support. An additional \$56,638 will be needed to meet our Ministry Center Building Loan payments.

At the Dec. 17 Council meeting, the following were elected as Council officers: Susan Dawkins, chair; Johnny Merck, vice chair; and Deborah Ruff, secretary.

Also, at the Dec. 17 meeting, Council appointed Mike Whitlock to replace Kay Chandler, who resigned from Council effective, Dec. 31, 2019. Mike will fill the remaining two years of Kay's term.

Congregation Council met on Tuesday, Dec. 17 at 7 p.m. All members were present except Everett Crafts, Deborah Ruff, Mike Davenport, Mike Shealy, and Bill Fleming, all of whom were excused, Newly-elected Council members, were also present. After the reading of the Mission Statement, devotions were led by Pastor Michael.

New Business

Council Officers were elected for 2020: Susan Dawkins - Chair; Johnny Merck - Vice Chair; and Deborah Ruff - Secretary.

Council appointed Mike Whitlock to replace Kay Chandler, who resigned from Council effective Dec. 31, 2019, to focus more on other areas of her life at this time. Council agreed that the nominee with the next largest number of votes from last year's ballot (when Kay was elected) should be appointed, which was Mike Whitlock. (Note: Mike has accepted this appointment.)

After discussion, annual Council Retreat was scheduled for Saturday, January 11, 2020, from 10 a.m.-12 p.m.

Ministry Team assignments were made to ensure that at least one Council member is on each team: Care and Fellowship - Dale Shealy; Good News - Everett Crafts, Mike Shealy; Christian Schools - Susan Dawkins, Chop Cooper; Lifelong Education - Pastor Michael, Cindy Amick; Community Hope - Kathy Brown, Mike Shealy, Wayne Mitchell; Worship - Deborah Ruff; Youth Ministry - Lynn Wessinger; Facilities - Johnny Merck; and Finance - Chad Frick.

Council also reappointed the following for 2020, pending acceptance: Choir Director/Organist - Eddie Rivers; Financial Secretary - Beverly Hawkins; Scholarship Fund Treasurer - Candace Frick; Campership Fund Treasurer - Teresa Cooper; Current Fund Treasurer - Linda Cromer; Maintenance Fund Treasurer - Edwina Wicker; Building Fund Treasurer - Kim Metz; and Community Service Fund Treasurer - Julie Shealy.

Regarding our search for a new Current Fund Treasurer, Steve Stubbs shared that he spoke with the church's insurance company who stated that there are no liability issues with a church member or church staff member serving as Treasurer, but we will be required to have a financial records review every six months to a year. Johnny Merck shared that he called the Synod office and spoke to Rev. Ozzie Herlong who also stated that there is no problem or conflict of interest with a church member/staff member being treasurer, except that person must excuse himself or herself from any vote on his or her salary. The person who had been asked to serve requested more time to consider this. Meanwhile, we will continue to advertise.

Pastor Michael requested that \$14,000 of his salary be designated for housing. Council approved unanimously.

After Pastor Michael and Dale Shealy (husband of the office secretary) were excused, Council discussed giving bonuses to the pastor, the organist/choir director, and secretary and unanimously agreed to give the same amount given last year to each.

Ministry Team Reports

Care and Fellowship Team - Advent Fellowship Night was a success with 26 in attendance. Collector/Hobby Fair will be Jan. 19.

Christian Schools Team - Over 400 people attended the Preschool Christmas program. A Love offering of \$445 was received for Manna House.

Community Hope Team - Backpack Ministry serves 14 children. Team continues to support Manna House.

Facilities Team - The roof in the men's bathroom in the hallway has been fixed. However, there is a leak in the kitchen ceiling. Chop Cooper spoke with Thad Mayes who is to come assess and repair this. Chop shared that a safety switch has to be put on the boiler, which will cost about \$1,100.

Good News Team - More volunteers have stepped forward to assist with the front sign.
